PROJECT LOCATION: Fort Meade, Florida

PROJECT APPLICATION:

Permeable and ADA-Accessible Parking

PROJECT SUMMARY:

A historical park in one of Florida's oldest cities, Fort Meade, has replaced a dirt parking area with a porous hard-surfaced pavement, FILTERPAVE™. As part of a renovation to bring the park to ADA code, the City of Fort Meade added ADA-accessible parking and restroom facilities at Heritage Park.



ABOUT THE FILTERPAVE™ SYSTEM

The FILTERPAVE™ system is a highly aesthetic, eco-friendly pavement product made from 100% post-consumer recycled glass aggregate, bonded with a natural binder. The material forms a hard-surface pavement that is completely permeable, allowing stormwater to infiltrate as well as filter fluids from automobiles. The color of the pavement can vary depending on the color of aggregate added and is as safe as any traditional surface on which to walk or drive.

RECYCLED GLASS

With the nation's abundant glass source currently going to the landfills despite recycling efforts, this pavement system makes constructive use of the recycled glass material. In fact, 90 typical glass beverage bottles are used in just one square foot of pavement. This not only makes productive use of the millions of tons of recycled glass, but it conserves the supply of natural aggregate supplies and saves energy used in mining efforts related to typical hard-surface pavement.

APPLICATIONS

In addition to parking areas, the FILTERPAVE™ system is used for trails and walkways, driveways, sidewalks and pedestrian areas.

INSTALLATION

The system is installed by certified contractors with specialty equipment.

ABOUT HERITAGE PARK



Heritage Park is the original location of the actual "Fort Meade" named after General George Gordon Meade of Civil War fame. Fort Meade is also the last place of the Seminole uprising during the Seminole Indian Wars and Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson's last station in his service with the United States Army. Later becoming a general in the Confederate Army, a monument honoring Stonewall Jackson is located at Heritage Park.
